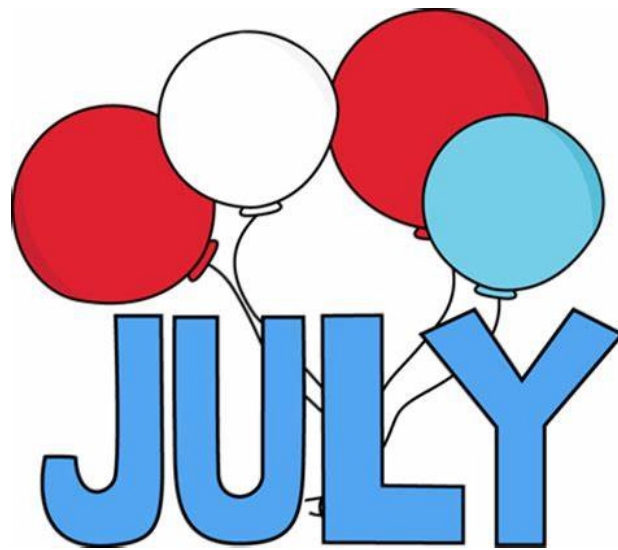

Pastor's Paragraphs

Dear Emmanuel,

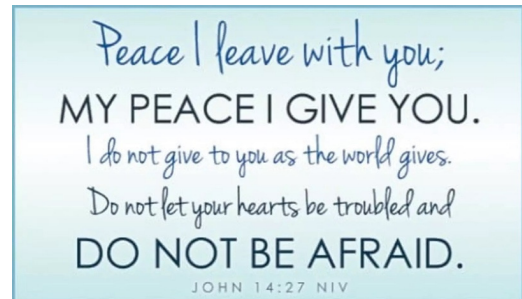
Some days, it feels like the world is unraveling. I don't say that to be dramatic. I say it because I know many of us are waking up each morning to news that tightens the chest and troubles the spirit. ICE raids are sweeping through neighborhoods, tearing families apart. In Gaza, entire communities grieve children who should still be alive. Here at home, anti-trans violence rises while the voices of LGBTQ+ people are silenced or distorted. Healthcare is more expensive, food insecurity is rising, and even Social Security—something many of us depend on—feels uncertain. And all of it is wrapped in the noise of politicians shouting over one another, grasping for power while people suffer in the margins.

It's a lot. I feel it too. As your pastor, I often wrestle with how to preach the gospel in a time like this. What does it mean to speak of resurrection when the air is thick with grief? What does it mean to speak of peace when the very systems we live in seem to thrive on division and exploitation? And yet... that's exactly what we are called to do. Jesus never promised that following him would be easy. He didn't say the road would be smooth or the work simple. What he did promise was presence. "Peace I leave with you," he said. "My peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." (John 14:27) But also notice what Jesus *doesn't* say. He doesn't say: "The world will stop being scary." He doesn't say: "You won't be overwhelmed." He says, "Do not be afraid"—not because the danger isn't real, but because *you are not alone in it*. The Spirit of Christ is alive and active even now, even here, even in the heartbreak.

And Christ's peace? It's not the kind of peace that looks like silence or avoidance or denial. It's a peace that rolls up its sleeves. A peace that reaches out to those cast aside. A peace that joins the protest and sets the table. A peace that calls out injustice and still makes room for joy. So, if you feel like you're at your limit, I want you to know that's not a failure of faith. It's a symptom of being human. And the beautiful thing about being human in the body of Christ is that we don't carry the weight alone.

Let's be a church that tells the truth. Let's be a church that mourns and prays and shows up for one another and the world. Let's be a church that reminds each other that we were made for this moment—not because we are strong, but because Christ is with us. Christ is in us. Christ is still calling us to love fiercely, serve boldly, and live like resurrection is real. We are still the church. And Christ is still leading us.



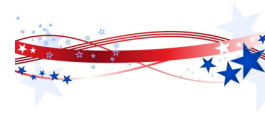

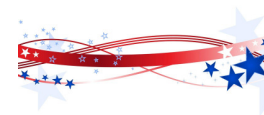
